Entry Restrictions

To participate in the 2018 inov-8 Descent Race Kitzbühel, athletes must be at least 16 years of age, fit to compete and competent in steep technical terrain. Participants under the age of 18 require written consent of a parent or legal guardian.

Ranking

Individual rankings in the categories

Entry fee

The entry fee of € 35,-- per participant is due at at submission of the online registration and must be paid into the organiser's bank account.

The entry is valid once the entry fee of € 35,-- has been paid into the bank account of the organiser (Verein Sport & Kultur Kitzbühel, Raiffeisenbank Kitzbühel, IBAN: AT563626300003496338 / BIC: RZTIAT22263).

A refund of the entry fee is not possible. Should the event be cancelled for reasons outside of the organiser's control, no refund will be given.

Cable car ticket

The start area of the event is at the summit station of the Hahnenkamm cable car ((Hahnenkammbahn). Anyone who does not hold a valid ticket for the cable car can purchase a return-ticket at the reduced rate of € 15,-- from the organiser during registration.

Equipment

Standard trailrunning-shoes are permitted. Safety equipment such as protectors or a helmet (also bike helmets) is allowed and recommended by the organiser.

Not permitted are: Spiked-shoes, golf shoes or football boots, grass-skies, poles or any technical aids.

The number must be visible in it's original form (not folded) and worn on the chest.

Wear your race number on your chest and don't fold or cut it down.

There will be a kit-check immediately before the start.

Liability and disclaimer

By registering for the event, participants agree to a the disclaimer, which will have to be signed at registration.

Participants start at their own risk and must accept the hazards inherent to movement over steep technical terrain. Personal Accident Insurance is highly recommended.

The participant accepts that neither the organiser nor the land owner are liable for any injury, loss or damage of any nature to the participant or their or third parties' property, arising out of participation in this race. You Instructions of safety personal (Mountain rescue, marshalls) must be adhered to.

Recording and publication of photos and video from the event

By entering you consent to be photographed, filmed and/or otherwise recorded. Your entry constitutes your consent to such photography, filming and/or recording and to any use of the material in any and all media.

Briefing

A short race briefing will take place in the start area half an hour before the first run.

Race

As with the course of a giant slalom, the course must be followed as set. There will be a heat. The top 30 in each category qualify for the final and will start in reverse order. Both passes are added together.

Start intervall Heat: 30 sec

Startintervall Final: 1 min

Participants must be in the start area 15 minutes ahead of their run.

The finish will be under the finish arch. Every participant must return to the start by foot after their run. Depending on fitness, this will take approximately 15 minutes.

Conduct and sportsmanship

Fair conduct and sportsmanship towards other participants and race staff, as well as toward other persons along the route, such as hikers and spectators, is a necessity for participation.

Any Competitor who acts in a manner that brings the event into disrepute or endangers another competitor, marshal or member of the public may receive a time penalty (up to disqualification from the event).

Disqualification, time penalties

Where gates are missed or the course is not followed correctly, the participant will be disqualified.

Unsporting conduct can lead to time penalties or disqualification of the participant.

Complaints procedure and protest fee

Protests must be made within 15 minutes of the provisional results being posted in the start area.

Protest fee = € 50,--

In case of a protest this fee must be paid to the organiser. Where a protest is upheld, this fee will be refunded. Where a protest is denied, the fee remains with the organiser.

Refreshments

There will be free drinks available for participants in the start area.

Emergency services

Kitzbühel Mountain Rescue will be in charge of rescue service. übernommen. In case of bad weather helicopter rescues may not be possible.

Kit storage

There will be changing facilities by the Hahnenkamm cable car station. The organiser accepts no liability for clothing or equipment left there.

Prizes

The top five of each category will be awarded vouchers to a total value of € 2,500,--
